

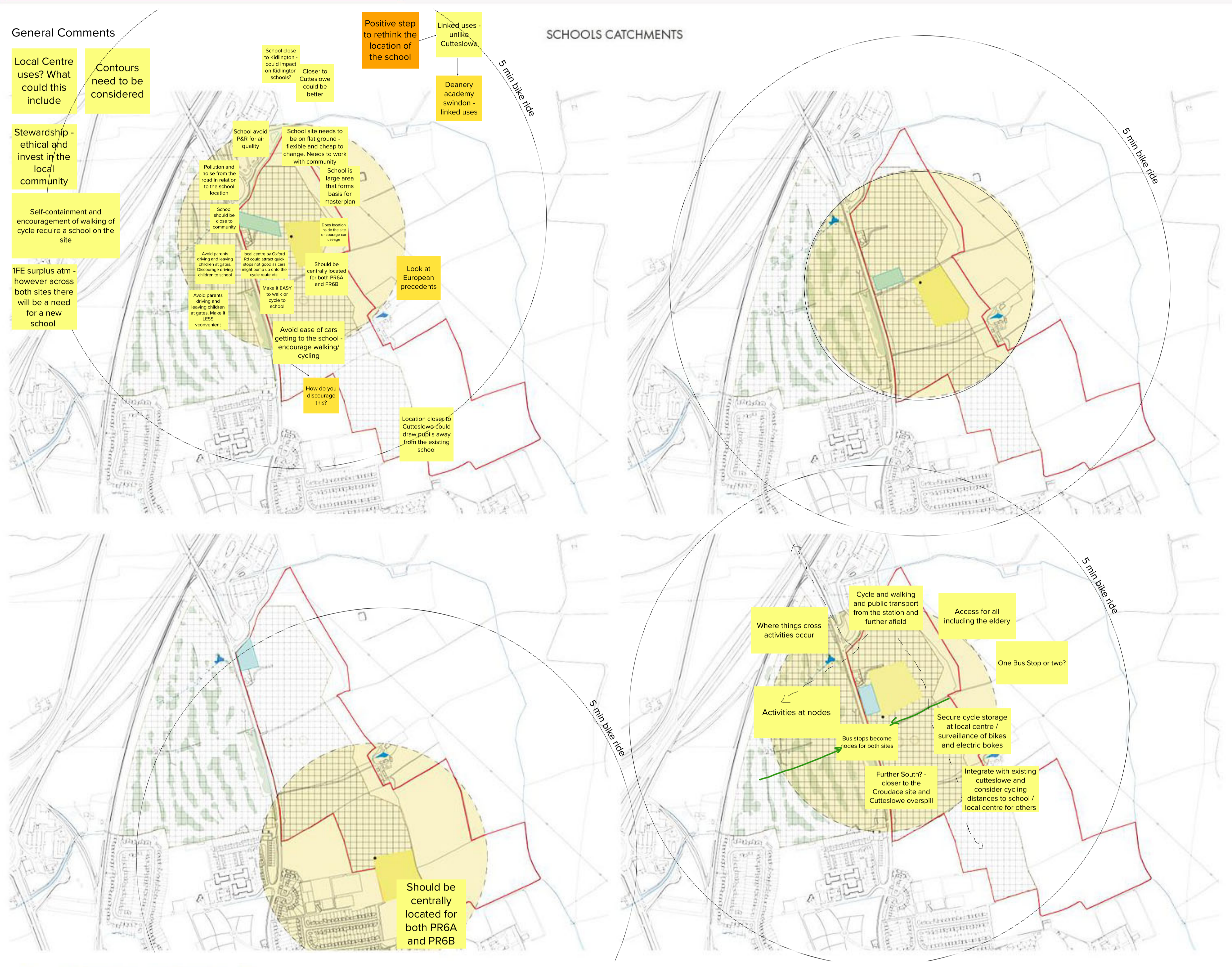
USES AND CONNECTIVITY

Enquiry by Design - Session 2

Site PR&A is required to deliver various uses explained in the Local Plan Policy. The policy map shows proposed locations for the primary school and local centre, however Cherwell District Council has confirmed that these should be considered further as part of design work.

New homes are the key use to be provided on the site. Policies define much of the housing requirements (such as the amounts and types of homes provided).
